



Prices for Non-Insured Surgical and Diagnostic Services

Kensington Health is proud to operate a not-for-profit [community surgical and diagnostic centre](#), offering eye surgeries and diagnostic imaging and infusion services in a comfortable and accessible community setting.

Most of these services are covered by the Ontario Health Insurance Program, or OHIP. Based on their professional judgement and your unique health needs, a health care provider may provide options for an additional or enhanced test, service or medical device (e.g. lenses) that is not covered by OHIP. These recommendations are always based on best practice and clinical guidelines. In these cases, you may choose to pay an additional fee for the non-insured option.

Prices for the non-insured services and options offered at our community surgical and diagnostic centre are listed below. As a not-for-profit organization, Kensington Health seeks to keep our prices for non-insured services low while covering our costs.

Patients always have the option to receive only the services and options covered by OHIP. They are high-quality and reliable. There is no pressure to purchase non-insured services. Doing so will not affect the way you are treated, your wait-time, or your access to the insured services in any way.

These decisions should be made in close consultation with your health service provider. You are encouraged to ask them questions about your unique circumstances and needs so you have all the information you need to make the right decision for you.

Specialty Cataract Lenses and Surgery		
Aspherical lens	This specialty intraocular lens for cataract surgery is not covered by OHIP. This lens is designed to provide clearer and sharper images, day and night. This type of lens may improve vision for varying light conditions such as night vision and foggy/rainy conditions.	\$190 - \$650 per eye
Toric lens	This specialty intraocular lens for cataract surgery is not covered by OHIP. This type of lens provides excellent vision for a patient with a clinically significant amount of astigmatism who wishes to decrease their dependence on glasses for astigmatism correction.	\$370 - \$860 per eye
Presbyopic, Trifocals, extended vision lens	<p>These specialty intraocular lenses for cataract surgery are not covered by OHIP. These types of lenses make patients less dependent on glasses for all distances after cataract surgery. Although these lenses provide good vision at all distances, some patients may still require glasses based on their specific conditions.</p> <p>These lenses are proven to reduce glare and halos around lights at night than standard spherical (OHIP-covered) and aspheric lenses. However, most people will adapt and do not notice these conditions after a few weeks.</p>	\$1200 - \$1560 per eye
Laser-assisted cataract surgery	Use of Femtosecond-assisted (Femto) laser during the cataract surgical procedure.	\$1200 per eye
Diagnostic Imaging		
Sinus X-Ray	Sinus x-rays are no longer covered by OHIP but may still be ordered by referring physicians to diagnose chronic sinus infections.	\$33.72
Infusion Services		
Nursing chair fee, Monoferric	The nursing fee for the infusion of Monoferric to patients is not covered by OHIP in an outpatient setting.	\$85.00
